

In January 1924, Tommy Lee married Margaret (Louie) Jones and the reception was held in the Church Hall, the first major event to be held in the Hall.

1924 saw the lane to the Hall surfaced with tar macadam, supplied by TG Thorne of Ilston Quarry (the work was supervised by his employee, Tommy Lee, hence the labour was free!).

By June 1926 the front boundary wall was built and the Hall walls rendered. In 1927 the Rev. RW Lockyer retired and as a parting gift Rowland paid off the entire remaining debt on the new hall amounting to £172. (Percy Rowland later became bankrupt, sold Fairy Hill and lived for a time at "Green Lodge"). In 1928 the "pay box" with cloakroom was erected inside the main hall doors and in 1932 a tar macadam path was laid alongside the hall to give better access to the rooms behind the stage "*a much needed improvement, thanks to Mr T Lee who superintended the work*". Electricity arrived in 1934 and footlights were provided for the stage a few years later.
